

# CINNAMINSON TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

June 3, 2019

Mayor McGill announces that the Regular Meeting of the Township Committee is being held at 7:35 p.m. in the Municipal Building, 1621 Riverton Road, Cinnaminson, NJ 08077. This meeting is being held in accordance with the "Open Public Meetings Act," P.L. 1975 c.231, having been duly noticed to the Burlington County Times and the Courier Post on January 11, 2019.

In attendance: Mr. Conda, Mrs. Kravil, Mr. Segrest, Deputy Mayor Horner, Mayor McGill. Also present: Administrator Eric Schubiger, CFO Julia Edmondson, Municipal Clerk Lisa Passione; Alen Arnautovic, Solicitor. Also present: Police Chief Richard Calabrese, Fire Marshall Danny Norman, Michael Murphy and Gary Smalley from Republic Services

Mayor McGill opens the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **Best Practices review of Sewerage Authority and Fire District**

Mayor McGill states that to satisfy the State's Best Practice requirements we need two committee members to meet with the Fire District and Sewerage Authority to assess the continued viability of these entities and report back to the full committee at a future meeting. Mrs. Kravil volunteers to meet with the Fire District. Mr. Conda will meet with the Sewerage Authority.

## **St. Charles Carnival and Riverton Country Club Fireworks**

Chief Calabrese and Emergency Management Coordinator Danny Norman update committee members on the arrangements for public safety and emergency management at the St. Charles Carnival which is June 10 through June 15<sup>th</sup> and the fireworks display by Riverton Country Club which will be June 27<sup>th</sup>.

## **CONSENT AGENDA:**

Mr. Segrest reads a statement regarding the award of the solid waste contract.

This contract award is a result of significant review by this committee and our professionals. We are focusing on the method and scheduling of collection. Collection will be Wednesdays and Thursdays. Residents whose trash was collected on Friday will now be collected on Thursday. Residents who currently have pickup on Wednesday and Thursday will see no change in their schedule. Automated trash receptacles will be delivered to each property owner prior to this changeover. Bulk collection will be provided once a month, on the first collection date of each month. We collectively agree that awarding this contract is in the best interest of the township, is financially prudent and will maximize the efficiency of this important public service. We will work closely with the contractor and our professionals in developing a plan for implementing the improved service this year.

## **END OF CONSENT AGENDA**

Mayor McGill asks for a motion to open the public comment on consent agenda only. MOTION TO OPEN MADE BY MR. SEGREST, seconded by Mr. Conda. Voice vote. All aye.

Ben Young, 116 Woodview Lane – Applauds committee for moving in the right direction with trash collection. Asks how will residents be notified of change in trash pickup? Mr. Schubiger responds that they are working with the contractor. The township will work with the contractor in assisting to make the transition as seamless as possible. No date for transfer has been set.

Michael Goins, 100 Purnell – Asks if there will be different sized containers or just one size. Recommends rewards as well as penalties be used as incentives. Mr. Schubiger states the base can will be large but there will be an alternative small can. The first can is included.

Roger Hare, 2603 Yellowstone Road – Inquires if there will be a charge for an additional container. Additional cans may be purchased by homeowner at additional cost for approximately \$50.

Richard Dietrich, 19 Emerson Drive – By laws of Poets Walk do not allow for containers to be outside. He is concerned with the size of containers.

Roger Hare, 2603 Yellowstone Road – Asks about wording of prior solid waste contract. He suggests that the new contract have stronger language.

Seeing no one else come forward Mayor McGill closes public comment on the consent agenda.

Mayor McGill asks for a motion to approve the consent agenda. MOTION TO APPROVE CONSENT AGENDA MADE BY MR. HORNER, seconded by Mayor McGill. Roll call vote. Mrs. Kravil makes a statement that she is not happy with the service level of Republic Services; neither are the residents. Republic has assured us that the service will improve and legally we will have provisions in place but we need to make sure that we as Township Committee hold them accountable. Our residents are entitled to receive the service that they are being promised. Mrs. Kravil votes aye. All ayes. Consent agenda is approved.

Roger Hare, 2603 Yellowstone Road – Where is the township at with COAH (Counsel on Affordable Housing)? Mr. Schubiger updates Mr. Hare on the status, that there has been a settlement made. The next step is a compliance hearing in the next four to six weeks.

Seeing no one else come forward, Mayor McGill asks for a motion to close the public comment portion of the meeting. MOTION TO CLOSE PUBLIC COMMENT MADE BY MR. SEGREST, seconded by Mr. Horner. Voice vote. All ayes. Public Comment is closed.
