RESOLUTION 2021 – 91

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CINNAMINSON APPROVING THE SETTLEMENT IN THE MATTER OF DELORES O. SIMMONS V. LISA PASSIONE, ET AL. DOCKET NO. BUR-L-607-21

WHEREAS, Delores O. Simmons and Obafemi O. Simmons ("Simmons") filed an Order to Show Cause and Verified Complaint against Cinnaminson Township, Lisa Passione, and the Cinnaminson Township Police Department ("Township") with the Burlington County Law Division, captioned and docketed as Delores O. Simmons and Obafemi O. Simmons v. Lisa Passione, Cinnaminson Township Police Department, Cinnaminson Township, Docket No. Bur-L-607-21 pursuant to the Open Public Records Act ("OPRA"); and

WHEREAS, while Simmons alleges a violation of OPRA, the Township specifically denies any violation of OPRA or any other law and believes that had this matter proceeded to a trial, the Township would have prevailed and furthermore, the Township asserts at all times that it has complied with OPRA and that Simmons was never denied access to any public records; and

WHEREAS, the parties have engaged in settlement negotiations; and

WHEREAS, as a result of those settlement negotiations, all controversies between Simmons and the Township have been resolved; and

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to resolve this matter to minimize costs and legal expenses to the Township without admitting any liability whatsoever; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body is of the opinion that the settlement is in the best interests of the Township.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee, of the Township of Cinnaminson, in the County of Burlington, State of New Jersey for the reasons set forth above that it hereby approves the Settlement Agreement and Mutual Release, attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Township Solicitor are hereby authorized to implement this Resolution and execute any documents necessary in connection therewith.

RESOLUTION 2021 – 92

RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE MONTH OF MAY AS "BAG UP NJ" MONTH

- WHEREAS, P.L.202, c.117, signed into law on November 4, 2020 is the most progressive disposable bag law in the country, -with the goal of phasing out single-use plastic and paper bags and encouraging the use of reusable bags throughout New Jersey; and
- WHEREAS, New Jersey is working to reduce reliance on single-use products to ensure that future generations have a clean and healthy environment to live, work, and recreate in; and
- WHEREAS, banning or limiting the use of single-use plastic and paper carryout bags 1s a significant step in this effort; and
- WHEREAS, the New Jersey Clean Communities Council, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, the New Jersey Department of State, policymakers, environmental and business groups, as well as other stakeholders, are working together to educate consumers, businesses, and communities about the new law and encouraging residents to "Bag Up" before the ban on single-use plastic bags goes into effect on May 4, 2022; and
- WHEREAS, the comprehensive "Bag Up NJ" campaign will include educational programs, public and media engagement and reusable bag distribution programs throughout the state, with an emphasis on underserved communities; and
- WHEREAS, this statewide public education campaign will provide residents, businesses and visitors with information about the types of reusable and sustainable bags and containers that they may use and where to access these products.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE TT RESOLVED**, by the Township of Cinnaminson, that it is critical to begin educating the public about this new law; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that one way to gain important recognition is to deem the month of May each year as "Bag Up NJ" month in the Township of Cinnaminson, as a further reminder that all residents should bring their own reusable bags to the store; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that a copy of this resolution shall be transmitted to the NJ Clean Communities Council, and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.

WHEREAS, the Tax Collector seeks to balance the account in recognition of the exemption
