



**EPA Invites Public Comment on a Proposed Cleanup Plan  
for the Cinnaminson Groundwater Contamination Superfund Site  
in Cinnaminson and Delran, New Jersey**

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued a **Proposed Plan** to address soil and groundwater contamination at the Cinnaminson Groundwater Contamination Superfund site on **August 1, 2022**. The Proposed Plan is available at [www.epa.gov/superfund/cinnaminson](http://www.epa.gov/superfund/cinnaminson).

EPA's preferred cleanup plan for the site includes digging up and disposing contaminated soil and cleaning up the contaminated groundwater by using a technique called in-situ chemical reduction. The cleanup plan also includes investigating and mitigating vapor intrusion at nearby residential properties and instituting long-term monitoring to ensure the cleanup is working as intended.

A **30-day public comment period** for the Proposed Plan will run from **August 1, 2022 to August 31, 2022**. To address public questions and concerns about the proposed cleanup plan, EPA will host a **virtual public meeting on Wednesday, August 10, 2022 from 6:00pm–8:00pm EST**.
