RULES GOVERNING PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The Rules of Conduct and Decorum for public participation during Committee meetings for addressing Township Committee during public hearings on ordinances or resolutions which require public hearings or during the public portion of the Committee meetings are as follows:

- All members of the public attending Township Committee Meetings must treat each other the Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Committee Members and Township employees with respect.
- Shouting out from the audience without being recognized to speak is strictly prohibited.
- No person shall, at any time, engage in any personally offensive or abusive remarks to the Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Committee Members, Township employees or any other member of the public.
- No person shall engage in any express or implied speech that involves any other person's race, color, religion, gender, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, national origin or ethnicity.
- The Mayor or Presiding Officer may restrict, limit or prohibit any speech, remarks or questions that are repetitive or not germane to any matter not within the jurisdiction of Township Committee.
- Persons making public comment may not yield their time to another speaker and each individual is limited to speaking once during a particular public comment period for a period of time not to exceed five (5) minutes.
- The Chief of Police or such other member of the Police Department as he/she may designate, shall be designated as the Sergeant-at-Arms of the Township Committee meetings. The Sergeant-at-Arms shall carry out all orders and instructions given by the Mayor or the Presiding Officer of the Township Committee meeting for the purpose of maintaining order and decorum at the Township Committee meetings and enforcing these Rules.
- The Township Solicitor shall be the Parliamentarian.
- Meetings shall be in accordance with these Rules and Roberts Rules of Order for items not covered in these regulations.
- Members of the public who make comments or ask questions that are germane to an ordinance or resolution that is under consideration or during the general public portion of the Committee meeting for matters which are within the jurisdiction of the Township Committee shall be allowed to do so in an uninterrupted manner unless the member is not adhering to these Rules of Conduct and Decorum.
- Following the close of a particular public comment period, the Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Committee Members, and Township employees reserve the right to answer questions and respond to comments.
- All questions and comments shall be through the Mayor or Presiding Officer unless waived.

WHEREAS, on August 26, 2025, FSHC filed a letter seeking additional information and documentation before the HEFSP was approved by the Program and trial court; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Terrence R. Cook approved a consent order conditional compliance certification (“Consent Order”) on February 13, 2026, executed by the Township and FSHC, that provides the conditions which must be met in order for the Township to be granted a compliance certification; and

WHEREAS, a spending plan has been prepared entitled “Cinnaminson Township, Burlington County, Affordable Housing Trust Fund Spending Plan” dated March 2026; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Consent Order and the Amended FHA, the Township must adopt a spending plan, which provides for the use of Affordable Housing Trust Funds in furtherance of the provision of affordable housing in the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee now desires to adopt “Cinnaminson Township, Burlington County, Affordable Housing Trust Fund Spending Plan” dated March 2026.

WHEREAS, the Township must adopt and approve an Affirmative Marketing Manual to effectuate the Plan; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Committee of the Township of Cinnaminson, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey on this 16th day of March, 2026, that:

1. The Township of Cinnaminson hereby adopts and approves the Affirmative Marketing Manual attached hereto, or in a form substantially consistent with the attached.

**AUTHORIZING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF AN AFFORDABILITY
ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AND THE ADOPTION OF THE
AFFORDABILITY ASSISTANCE MANUAL PURSUANT TO FOURTH
ROUND AFFORDABLE HOUSING COMPLIANCE**

WHEREAS, the Township of Cinnaminson (“Township”) previously adopted a mandatory development fee ordinance that established standards for the collection, maintenance, and expenditure of development fees to be used for supporting and providing low- and moderate-income housing in the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township has established an affordable housing trust fund; and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2024, Governor Murphy signed into law P.L. 2024, c.2, which amended the New Jersey Fair Housing Act (“Amended FHA”); and

WHEREAS, the Township filed a timely Fourth Round Declaratory Judgment action with the Affordable Housing Dispute Resolution Program (“Program”) under Docket No. BUR-L-238-25, along with its binding resolution, on January 30, 2025; and

WHEREAS, on April 17, 2025, the Program prepared an order fixing the Township’s obligation and authorizing the Township to proceed with preparing and adopting its Housing Element and Fair Share Plan (“HEFSP”) for the Fourth Round; and

WHEREAS, on June 10, 2025, the Township filed its HEFSP; and

WHEREAS, on August 26, 2025, FSHC filed a letter seeking additional information and documentation before the HEFSP was approved by the Program and trial court; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Terrence R. Cook approved a consent order conditional compliance certification (“Consent Order”) on February 13, 2026, executed by the Township and FSHC, that provides the conditions which must be met in order for the Township to be granted a compliance certification; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has or will adopt an updated mandatory development fee ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has or will adopt a fourth round spending plan, entitled “Cinnaminson Township, Burlington Township, Affordable Housing Trust Fund Spending Plan” dated March 2026 (“Spending Plan”); and

WHEREAS, the Amended FHA, N.J.S.A. 52:27D-329.2, mandates that municipalities must set aside a portion of their development fee trust fund for the purpose of providing affordability assistance. The Township’s Spending Plan authorizes the following affordability assistance programs: security deposit assistance, down payment assistance, emergency repairs/health/safety repairs, and energy assistance repairs, and the creation of additional very low-income units; and

WHEREAS, the Township wishes to authorize the implementation of the program pursuant to the Spending Plan; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the Consent Order and the Amended FHA, the Township desires to adopt the Affordability Assistance Manual to effectuate its HEFSP.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Cinnaminson, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey on this 16th day of March 2026, that:

1. The Township of Cinnaminson hereby adopts and approves the Affordability Assistance Manual attached hereto, or in a form substantially consistent with the attached.

2. The Township Committee hereby authorizes the Township Administrator and/or designee to execute any and all documents and agreements as called for to approve applicants to the Affordability Assistance Program in accordance with the approved Affordability Assistance Manual.
3. The Township Committee hereby authorizes the Township Administrator and/or designee to execute any and all necessary documents to allow for the disbursement of funds in accordance with the Spending Plan and the approved Affordability Assistance Manual.
4. The Township Committee hereby directs the Township Administrator and/or designee to provide regular reporting to the Committee on program disbursements, when requested.
5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, the Township appointed Triad Associates (“Triad”) to implement the Township’s Rehabilitation Program and to act as the Township’s Administrative Agent; and

WHEREAS, Triad created a Rental Rehabilitation Manual that is compliant with the Amended FHA and the Uniform Housing Affordability Controls (“UHAC”), N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.1 et seq, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee wishes to adopt the Rehabilitation Manual, prepared by Triad.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Committee of the Township of Cinnaminson, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, on this 16th day of March 2026, that:

1. The Township of Cinnaminson hereby adopts and approves the Rehabilitation Manual attached hereto, or in a form substantially consistent with the attached.

AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS PROPERTY VIA DONATIONS, SPECIFICALLY A 2018 SILVER DODGE CHARGER K-9 VEHICLE WITH VIN NUMBER 2C3CDXKT7JH174702 FROM TOWNSHIP OF CINNAMINSON TO CITY OF BORDENTOWN AND TO EFFECTUATE ANY PAPERWORK APPROPRIATE AND NECESSARY TO FINALIZE AND REGISTER THIS TRANSACTION, INCLUDING ANY DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED BY THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES

WHEREAS, the Township of Cinnaminson owns a 2018 Silver Dodge Charger K-9 Vehicle with Vin Number 2C3CDXKT7JH174702; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Cinnaminson has determined that it no longer has a valid governmental use for this vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bordentown has a need for such a vehicle for its own police force; and

WHEREAS, the parties intend to transfer ownership of the subject vehicle from the Township of Cinnaminson to the City of Bordentown by way of donation; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Cinnaminson has determined that the vehicle described herein is no longer needed for public use by the Township; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-36 provides, “The contracting unit need not advertise for bids when it makes any such sale to the United States, the State of New Jersey, another contracting unit, any body politic to which it contributes tax raised funds, any foreign nation which has diplomatic relations with the United States, or any governmental unit in the United States.”

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Committee of the Township of Cinnaminson, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, on this 16th day of March, 2026 that:

1. The Township of Cinnaminson hereby donates an “as-is” 2018 Silver Dodge Charger K-9 Vehicle with Vin Number 2C3CDXKT7JH174702 to the City of Bordentown.
2. The Township of Cinnaminson shall effectuate any paperwork appropriate and necessary to finalize and register this vehicle transaction, including any documentation required by the New Jersey Department of Motor Vehicles, and the Mayor and Township Clerk or designees are hereby authorized to sign any documentation required hereby.
3. The Township of Cinnaminson shall receive from the City of Bordentown the nominal consideration of \$1.00, the receipt of which is hereby waived.

ESTABLISHING A SIGN, BENCH, AND TREE DEDICATION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Cinnaminson wishes to provide residents with the opportunity to honor family members within Township parks and open spaces; and

WHEREAS, the Township proposes a Sign, Bench, and Tree Dedication Program (“Program”) under which a standard Township sign, bench, or tree may be dedicated to a loved one; and

WHEREAS, under the program, the cost of the sign, bench, or tree shall be borne by families or private donors, at no cost to the taxpayer, with assistance by the Township’s Department of Public Works in the installation or planting; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee finds that the Program is an appropriate manner in which to honor Cinnaminson Township residents and former residents.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Cinnaminson, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. A Sign, Bench, and Tree Dedication Program (“Program”) is hereby established in the Township of Cinnaminson. The Program is open to residents and former residents of Cinnaminson Township.
2. The Program shall be administered by the Township Administrator or his/her designee, with the advice and consent of the Township Committee Liaison to Parks and Recreation.
3. Signs, benches, and trees shall be installed or planted within Township parks and open spaces, but locations may be expanded at the discretion of the Township Committee.
4. The cost of the signs, benches, and trees shall be paid for by families or private donors, at no cost to the taxpayers. The Township’s Department of Public Works shall be responsible for installation or planting.
5. Applications shall be submitted to the Township Administrator for review and include the type of dedication (sign, bench, or tree) and exact wording to be placed on the dedication. Proofs shall be approved by the requestor prior to ordering.
6. The Township of Cinnaminson reserves the right to amend these policies and procedures when deemed necessary.

RESOLUTION 2026 – 55

ESTABLISHING A HOMETOWN HEROES PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Cinnaminson, in recognition of the great sacrifice made by members of the U.S. Military, wish to pay special tribute to deceased servicemembers; and

WHEREAS, the Township proposes a Hometown Heroes' Banner Program ("Program") under which banners printed with each service member's photo in uniform (if possible), name, rank, conflict, years of service and major awards would be displayed; and

WHEREAS, under the program, the cost of the production of banners shall be borne by families or private donors, at no cost to the taxpayer, with assistance by the Township's Department of Public Works in placing the banners on the poles associated with the program; and

WHEREAS, the Program will be administered by a Hometown Heroes' Banner Program Committee ("Committee") appointed by the Township Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee finds that the Program is an appropriate manner in which to honor deceased servicemembers with ties to the Township of Cinnaminson.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Cinnaminson, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. A Hometown Heroes' Banner Program ("Program") is hereby established in the Township of Cinnaminson. The Program is open to the families and loved ones of deceased veterans of the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or Coast Guard who have ties to the Township. Preference will begin with those who were Killed in Action, as they represent the highest sacrifice of a service member.
2. The Program shall be administered by a Hometown Heroes' Banner Program Committee ("Committee") to be appointed by the Township Committee. The Committee shall consist of a Chairperson and two (2) additional members. At least one member shall be an elected official. Member preference shall be given to U.S. Military veterans.
3. Banners will be printed with service member's photo in uniform, name, rank, conflict, years of service, awards (such as Medal of Honor, Purple Heart, Navy Cross, Silver Star, Bronze Star).
4. The banners will be displayed along the walking path in Memorial Park, but may be expanded at the discretion of the Township Committee.
5. The cost of banner product shall be paid for by families or private donors, at no cost to the taxpayers. The Township's Department of Public Works shall be responsible for placing banners on the poles associated with this program.
6. All banners in the first phase shall be 18" wide x 36" high of a uniform design as designated by the Committee. The number of banners produced each year will be determined by the Committee.
7. Banner applications shall be submitted to the Committee with a photo of the service member in uniform, along with the members DD-214. The Committee cannot honor requests to place specific banners in a specific location. Initial preference shall be given to those killed in action.
8. The Township of Cinnaminson reserves the right to amend these policies and procedures when deemed necessary.
